Chief Executive Officer Report

Local Laws

Council is conducting a review of its existing suite of local laws.

As part of this review, Council has identified the need to adopt new local laws, based on the Model Local Laws developed by the State. This is because:

- (a) Many of Council's existing local laws are either unenforceable, because they duplicate State legislation, or are difficult to enforce, because they are now outdated (having been adopted as early as 1994);
- (b) The Model Local Laws have been prepared by the Sate to streamline local government approvals and enforcement processes, and since their initial preparation in 2010, they have been adopted by many local governments throughout the State;
- (c) The Model Local Laws have been modified by Council's solicitors Preston Law, to be tailored specifically to Cherbourg, following a workshop with Councillors and Council officers.

The Local Laws

Section 28 of the Local government Act 2009 (LGA) provides;

(1) A local government may make and enforce any local law that is necessary or convenient for the good rule and local government of its local government area.

Section 29(1) of the LGA confirms that Council may decide its own process for making a local law.

In 2010, the State Government developed a suite of Model Local Laws, which are suitable for use by local governments. The Model Local Laws used here are:

- Local Law and Subordinate Local Law No. 1. (Administration);
- Local Law and Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management)
- Local Law and Subordinate Local Law No. 3 (Community and Environmental Management)
- Local Law and Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Indigenous Community Land Management)

It is proposed that Council adopts the Model Local Laws as its local laws, subject to appropriate changes, particularly to the Subordinate Local Laws, to reflect specific community requirements in Cherbourg.

- (a) To propose to adopt the following Local Laws and Subordinate Local Laws, in terms of the draft circulated at Council's meeting;
- (i) Local Law No. 1 and Subordinate Local Law No. 1 (administration);
- (ii) Local Law No. 2 and Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management);
- (iii) Local Law No. 3 and Subordinate Local Law No. 3 (Community and Community Environmental Management);
- (iv) Local Law No. 4 and Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Indigenous Community Land Management)

("the new Local Laws");

- (b) Pursuant to section 257 of the Local Government Act 2009 ("the Act), to delegate to the Chief Executive Officer of Council its powers to:
 - (i) Under section 29 (1) of the Act, decide the public consultation requirements for the New Local Laws and proceed with public consultation;
 - (ii) Under section 38 of the Act and section 15 of the Local Government Regulation 2012;
 - A. Decide how the review of the New Local Laws for anti-competitive provisions ('the Review") is to be conducted
 - B. Identify the matters with which the Review of the New Local Laws must deal;
 - C. decide the consultation process and how the process is to be used in the Review

9.35am Sandra Morgan, Grace Bond, Jeanette Brown entered meeting

Grace apologised for not being present for the Health Summit however posed questions regarding the Cherbourg Health Summit and subsequent Cherbourg Health Plan.

Re: Was there any community input into the Health Plan, was Cherbourg's 10 Point Plan considered, was Self Determination in regards to Cherbourg Health being taken away. Why was there no consultation with Major Stakeholders ie Cherbourg Health Action Group, Cherbourg Community Health's Christine Stewart, and Cherbourg Hospital's Tarita Fisher (local health staff with a lot of health experience not included).
